

TODAY'S EPISTLE 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 Brethren, this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.⁷So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.⁸And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work.⁹As it is written: "He has dispersed abroad, He has given to the poor; His righteousness endures forever."¹⁰Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness,¹¹while you are enriched in everything for all liberality, which causes thanksgiving through us to God.

TODAY'S GOSPEL Luke 16:19-31 The Lord spoke this parable: "There was a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and fared sumptuously every day.²⁰But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, full of sores, who was laid at his gate,²¹desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table. Moreover the dogs came and licked his sores.²²So it was that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried.²³And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom.²⁴Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.'²⁵But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted and you are tormented.²⁶'And besides all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed, so that those who want to pass from here to you cannot, nor can those from there pass to us.'²⁷Then he said, 'I beg you therefore, father, that you would send him to my father's house,²⁸'for I have five brothers, that he may testify to them, lest they also come to this place of torment.'²⁹Abraham said to him, "They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.'³⁰And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.'³¹But he said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead.'"

ON THE CHRISTIAN FORMATION OF OUR CHILDREN ...**

If you are truly interested in the welfare of your children, why do you not watch as strictly, but once a week, how they attend to their lessons in the study of the Law of God, as you do in some home-work, which the children seemed to be forced to have prepared within the next twelve hours for their public school? You must obey God, above the public and all other masters, or lose your souls for the responsibility which rests upon you for the present and future welfare of your children.



Teach the boy and girl geography and history; but if you do not train the child's will, in order not only to please you, his parents, but to bend before the holy will of Him, who is the only just rewarder of good and evil, then you are a failure as a Christian. Where there is no discipline, there is no dependability.

The Church opposes cremation; we cannot celebrate funerals for cremations.
